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What Am I?

My job is to remove sediment and pollutants from storm water. I prevent loose trash and harmful materials from entering to keep the bay clean. I have a lifespan of 50-70 years, provide lots of shade, produce acorns, and grow to be very tall. I am a historic sculpture that was gifted to the Sarasota Garden Club in the 1930s. I was found and refurbished in Tuttle's Puddle. I am a special species of bird that likes to lay their eggs at The Bay up high. I use bark, grasses, algae, and vines to build a comfy resting spot. By the mangroves, I am home to many critters such as fish, shrimp, and crabs. I was built to act as a natural buffer to help reduce coastal erosion. I protect inland structures and increase wildlife access. I provide habitat for giant swallowtails, birds, caterpillars, and more. You can find more than 200 species of butterflies along my paths. When two of us grow close together our tops join like a roof and create shelter for nearby animals such as box turtles, hawks, and owls. I am full of native flowers, plants, and grasses like goldenrod. I provide nesting sites and a protected environment for bees and insects. My umbrella-shaped leaves provide ample shade. I am native to Madagascar and have fiery orange colored flowers. We are thin around the trunk and our canopies

often grow to overlap one another.
